Who AreWe?

 A committee of students, teachers, parents, and faith and justice organizations concerned with the working conditions under which Catholic high school uniforms are made

Why AreWeHere?

 Our goal is to have a strong "No Sweat" uniform policy to guarantee that our uniforms are made under acceptable conditions, not in sweatshops.

W hatAre W e Against?





- We are against the use of sweatshops.
- We are NOT against the Board's policy of mandatory uniforms.
- We want to be sure that our uniforms, which we are required to buy and wear, are made in decent working conditions.

What Do We Want In The Policy?

The policy will require uniform suppliers to:

- Provide full public disclosure of factory locations where clothing is made
- Uphold International Labour Organization (ILO) standards and local labour laws
- Agree to independent monitoring

In cases of non-compliance, companies will be given time to comply. If a company still does not comply with the policy, the Board has the right to terminate the contract.

Process

 We request that members of the Toronto Catholic No Sweat Committee be involved in the development of our Board's No Sweat policy, to guarantee that OUR uniform clothing is made under acceptable conditions.
